WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we Lila D. Lindsey and L. W. Lindsey, her husband
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Seventeen Hundred DOLLARS,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said A. B. Rainer and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the city of Tulsa Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of lots five (5) six (6) seven (7) and eight (8) in Block twelve (12) in
Lindsey second addition to the City of Tulsa Indian Territory Western
District as is shown by the recorded plat and survey thereof. This deed made
to correct defect in description of deed between same parties to same real estate
made and executed on the 16th day of April, 1906

To have and to hold the same unto the said A. B. Rainer and unto his heirs and as-
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said A. B. Rainer that we will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, L. W. Lindsey, husband, wife of the said Lila D. Lindsey for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said A. B. Rainer all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
