WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we John O. Mitchell & Alice M. Mitchell, wife of John O. Mitchell, and W. P. Moore & Anna E. Moore
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty Two 50/100 DOLLARS,
to us in hand paid by Bert E. Jolidon, the receipt of which is
hereby acknowledged do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said Bert E. Jolidon and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the more addition to West Tulsa Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all of lot numbered two (2), in block number seven (7), situate
in more addition to West Tulsa Creek Nation Indian Territory
according to the recorded plat filed thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Bert E. Jolidon and unto his heirs and as-
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant we with said Bert E. Jolidon that we will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alice M. Mitchell, wife of the said John O. Mitchell, for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Bert E. Jolidon our all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
