KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred DOLLARS,
 to them paid by E. J. Bonacker
 receipt of which is hereby acknowledged do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said E. J. Bonacker and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
 described lot or parcels of ground lying and being situated in the town
 lands lying in the Muskogee Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:
Lots thirteen and fourteen (13 & 14) in Block
thirty nine (39) in the town of Red Fork in The
Creek Nation Indian Territory according to
plot now on file and of record in the
Indian Territory

To have and to hold the same unto the said E. J. Bonacker and unto his heirs and as-
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said E. J. Bonacker that we will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And Florence Palmer, wife of the said Thomas R. Palmer for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said E. J. Bonacker all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
