WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we Jacob I. Harlow and Alabama Harlow
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One DOLLARS,

do hereby grant,
bargain, sell and convey unto said Lillian Mendell and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
lands lying in the Western Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot number two (2) in block number thirteen (13) in the Town
of Beaver, D.T. according to the U.S. Grant plat thereof

To have and to hold the same unto the said Lillian Mendell and unto her heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Lillian Mendell that I will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alabama Harlow, wife of the said Jacob I. Harlow for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Lillian Mendell all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
