

# GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

## WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 27th day of Dec. 1905 one thousand nine hundred and five by and between George W. McNeahan and Dora McNeahan his wife of Broken Arrow, I.T. parties of the first part, and George Bullette of Tulsa, I.T. part of the second part.

WITNESSETH, That the said part of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred fifty (\$750) DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said part of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots 27, 28 and 29 in block 13 in the town of Broken Arrow, I.T.

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforegranted premises to the said George Bullette and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and we the said George W. McNeahan and Dora McNeahan his wife for ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said George Bullette and his heirs, successors and assigns, that we are lawfully seized in fee of the aforegranted premises; that they are free from all incumbrance; and that we have good right to sell and convey the same to said George Bullette as aforesaid; and that we will and our successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said George Bullette and his heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Dora McNeahan of Broken Arrow, I.T. wife of said George W. McNeahan, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said part of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.

McNeahan to me well known to be the person whose name appears upon the within and foregoing deed, and in the absence of her said husband, declared that she had of her own free will, executed said deed, and signed and sealed the relinquishment of dower and homestead in the foregoing deed for the consideration and purposes therein contained and set forth, without compulsion or undue influence of her said husband.
