

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

With relinquishment of dower and homestead (Wife's Separate Property) for married man's allotment

THIS INDENTURE, made and entered into this 7 day of Sept one thousand, nine hundred and 07 by and between Nancy Simmons and Alex Carr heirs at law of Anderson Atkins and Taylor Brown both deceased and Annie Carr wife of Alex Carr husband, both of Muskogee Co. Okla. parties of the first part, and Commercial Land Company a corporation of Muskogee Co. Okla. party of the second part.

WITNESSETH: That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and no other value in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part, the following described real estate and premises situate in the Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all their right title and interest in and to the section fourteen containing 40 acres more or less being the homestead of their deceased nephew and homestead south east quarter of south west quarter and north east quarter of south east quarter of section fourteen (44) township eighteen north Range fourteen west being the homestead of Anderson Atkins and Taylor Brown deceased containing 40 acres more or less being the homestead of their deceased nephew and homestead together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforegranted premises to the said Commercial Land Company and his heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and we the said Nancy Simmons and Alex Carr for ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said Commercial Land Company and his heirs successors and assigns that we are lawfully seized in fee of the aforegranted premises; that they are free from all incumbrances, that we have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Commercial Land Company and his heirs successors, heirs executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said Commercial Land Company and his heirs successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

and I Annie Carr of ver, wife of the said Alex Carr for and in consideration of the said sum of money do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right claim or possibility of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
