General Warranty Deed.
This Indenture, made this 10th
day of December A.D. 1907 between
E.R. Minshall and Marie C. Minshall,
his wife, of Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the

of the second part,

Witnesseth, The said parties of the first part, in
consideration of the sum of Sixteen hundred and $\frac{75}{100}$ Dollars,
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these
presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party
of the second part, their heirs and assigns, all of the
following described real estate situated in the County
of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to wit:

South-Half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the North-east Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section
Two (2), Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Thirteen (13) East
containing Eighty (80) Acres, more or less. To have and to
hold the same together with all and singular the tenements, her-
editaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any
wise appertaining forever. And said E.R. Minshall and Marie

ors, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said
