The Indenture made this 22nd day of November A.D. 1907, between Elizabeth Baker and John H. Baker, her husband, of Collinsville Oklahoma, parties of the first part, and The Olive Oil Company, a corporation of the City of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, party of the second part,

Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part in the consideration of the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000) Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, its successors or assigns all the following described real estate, situated in the northern part of Tulsa County and State of Oklahoma, as follows, to-wit: The South East Quarter of the South East Quarter and the South One-half of the North East Quarter of the South East Quarter and the North East Quarter of the North East Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section Nine, Township 21 North, Range 13 East of the Indian Base and Meridian.

To have and to hold the same, together with all the singular and tenements and hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining forever, and warrant title to the same.

Provided, always, and these presents are upon this express condition, that whereas said Elizabeth and John H. Baker have this day executed and delivered their certain promissory note in writing to said party of the second part, of which the following is a copy:

Tulsa Oklahoma November 22nd 1907

Eighteen months after date of note or either of us for value received promise to pay to the Olive Oil Company Fifty Thousand (\$50,000) Dollars without interest and non-negotiable to pay maturity.

For value received, I acknowledge sale of section and part of lot of the within mortgage, and same is hereby released.
