

All makers and signers, severally waiving demand, protest and notice of protest, and expressly authorizing the holder hereof to extend the time of payment of the note without notice and waiving all claims of extension on account of any such extension.

Now, in the said parties of the first part pay or cause to be paid unto the said party of the second part the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, or the sum of money in the above described note mentioned, together with interest thereon at the rate of five per cent per annum, then there shall be wholly discharged and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect. But if the full sum or sum of money, or any part thereof is not paid when the same is due, in the later and assessments of every nature which are or may be assessed or levied against said premises or any part thereof, are not paid when the same are by law made due and payable, then the whole of said sum or sums shall by these presents become due and payable and said party of the second part shall be entitled to said premises.
