

## Warranty Deed.

Know all men by these presents:

That the Alumna Townsite Company, a corporation, organized and existing under and by virtue of the act of Congress of February 18, 1901 (providing for the formation of corporations in the Indian Territory), in consideration of forty (\$40.00) dollars cash in hand, paid to it by B. T. Groves, of Robinson, Oklahoma, the receipt of which is fully acknowledged, does hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto B. T. Groves all the following described parcel of land situated in the town of Alumna, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, (according to the survey and plat of town submited in the land described as the east half of the southwest quarter and lot three (3) of section thirty (30) town fifteen (15) Range fourteen (14) east, according to the United States survey) said parcel of land being known and designated upon the <sup>Block number nineteen (9) Lot number</sup> plan of same as: Lot number thirteen (13), fourteen (14) Block number nineteen (19), together with all the improvements thereon and the appurtenances thereto belonging and warrants the title to the same.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises unto the said B. T. Groves and his heirs, successors and assigns forever, free, clear and discharged of and from all former grants, charges, taxes, judgments, mortgages and other liens and encumbrances of whatever nature.
