

Warrant Deed.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That Oleicker Oil Company (incorporated), of New
Hope Indian Territory, for the consideration of Two
hundred and Fifty (\$50) Dollars to it duly paid by
Union Construction Company of Tulsa, Okl. Co. (the
receipt of which is hereby acknowledged), does hereby
grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Union
Construction Company, the following described real estate
lying and being situated in Creek Nation, Indian Territory,
to wit: The South half of the South East Quarter of the
North West Quarter of Section Eighteen (18), Township Nine
Tenn (19) North and Range Fifteen (12) East of the Indian
Base and Meridian in the Indian Territory, being
20 acres more or less, together with all and singularith
improvement, right, title and interest whatsoever belonging
to it and to hold unto the said grantee its heirs
and assigns forever. And the said grantor hereby
covenants with the said grantee that at the execution
ing of these presents, the premises above described
are free from all incumbrance and that the said
Oleicker Oil Company will warrant and defend the title
thereto to the said grantee, its heirs and assigns
against the lawful claims of all persons whatsoever
on either interest. The said grantor has heretofore
