

Whereas, the said commission has awarded the real estate described hereinbelow to Thomas A. Dillinger who has paid thirtyseven + ⁵⁰/₁₀₀ (\$ 37.50) dollars, the full amount of the purchase price, into the treasury of the United States, to the credit of the Muskogee or Creek Nation of Indians with the United States Indian Agent, at Muskogee, Indian Territory, and is, therefore, entitled to a patent;

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, do, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States, hereby grant, sell, and convey unto the said Thomas A. Dillinger, heirs and assigns forever, all the right, title, and interest of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, aforesaid, in and to Lot numbered 3 in Block numbered 110, in the Town of Tulsa, Muskogee (Creek) Nation, Indian Territory, and according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.

In Witness whereof, I, the Principal Chief of the Muskogee (Creek) Nation, have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of said nation to be affixed at the date herein after shown.
