I now all men by these Presents: that I Cora B. Wiles and John W. Wiles her husband for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars cash in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged do hereby grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Mary Whitting widow of William Whitting deceased and unto her heirs and assigns forever the following lands lying in the Western District of the Indian Territory to wit:

All of Lot Three (3) in Block Two (2) in Town's Addition to the City of Tulsa Indian Territory according to the recorded plat thereof. To have and to hold the same unto the said Mary Whitting and unto her heirs and assigns forever with all appurtenances thereunto belonging, and hereby covenant with said Mary Whitting that they will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I John W. Wiles husband of the said Cora B. Wiles for and in consideration of the said sum of money do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Mary Whitting all my right of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
