To } The inclosure made this 15th day of April
 Clarissa Decd. 1908. Between Don Louis as Survivor of the
 County of Pikes in the State of Oklahoma, Party of the
 first part, and Clarissa Decd. of the County of Pikes in
 the State of Oklahoma, Party of the second part, Willmott's
 Trust, Whereas, Clarissa Decd. on the 24th day of
 May, 1907, file her petition in the United District Court
 of the Indian Territory, for the Western District thereof,
 sitting at Tulsa in said Western District, against
 Adelle Davis, Nathaniel Benjamin, Mary Benjamin,
 Abner Benjamin and John W. Benjamin, as defendants,
 and in said suit, asking that the land herein-
 after described be partitioned between herself and the
 said defendants; and,

Whereas, said defendants were duly summoned
 and appeared in said cause by their duly appointed
 Guardian ad litem, Benjamin D. Rice who denied
 in said answer each and every material allegation
 in said Plaintiff's petition; and

Whereas, said cause was referred to Honorable
 E. W. Benthworth Master in Chancery of said United
 States District Court of the Indian Territory, who, after
 taking the testimony in said cause found that
 the land hereinafter described was allotted to the heirs
 of Louis Benjamin deceased who was a Creek Citizen;
 and that the parties to said suit are the only
 heirs of the said Louis Benjamin and that an un-
 divided one-sixth interest in said land and so re-
 ported to the said Court which did on the 24th
 day of August, 1907, duly approve his report; and
 Whereas, upon the 15th day of November, 1907, the
 Indian Territory, became through the proclamation
