Quit Claim Deed with relinquish-
ment of dower.

Frank P. Blakemoor. This Indenture, made this
24 day of April A.D. 1906 between S. K. Williams and Bessie
L. Williams of Muskogee, Indian Territory, Western District,
party of the first part, and Frank P. Blakemoor and ^{co} of
South McAlester, Indian Territory, ^{Western District}, party of the
second part.

Witnesseth: That the said party of the first part,
for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar
in hand paid by the said party of the second part
(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have devised,
released, sold, conveyed and quitclaimed, and by these
presents, do devise, release, sell and convey and quit-
claim unto the said party of the second part, her
heirs and assigns forever, all the right, title, interest,
claim and demand which said party of the first part,
in and to the following described lot, piece or parcel of
land or improvements situated in the Indian Ter-
ritory, Western District, and known and described as follows:
to wit: The N¹/₂ of the N. W¹/₄, and the S W¹/₄ of the N. W¹/₄
of Sec. 31, Thirty one, Town of P 19 N. and Range 14 E.

And I, Bessie L. Williams, wife of the said, S. K.
Williams, for and in consideration of the said sum
of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
party of the second part, all my right of dower and
homestead in and to the said lands.

To have and to hold the same together with all
and singular the appurtenances and privileges there-
unto belonging or appertaining and all the estate, right,
title, interest and claim whatever of the said party of
the first part, either in law or equity, to the only
proper use, benefit and behoof of the said party of the
second part, to have and assigns forever.
