

Quit Claim (Cont.)

The Indians, made on the second day of May A. D. one thousand nine hundred and eight (1908) by and between Virginia H. Ott and Phil B. Ott, for hundreds of the County of Tulsa and State of Missouri; parties of the first part, and E. B. Bradshaw of the County of Tulsa, in the State of Oklahoma, party of the second part. Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of one no dollars to them paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents, remise, release and forever Quit Claim unto the said party of the second part, the following described lots, tracts, or parcels of land, lying, being and situate in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma to-wit: All of lot two (2), in Block seven hundred and thirty four (34) according to the official plat thereof, in the town of Tulsa in the State of Oklahoma (Formerly Indian Territory).

To have and to hold the same with all the rights, immunities, privileges and appurtenances thereof belonging unto the said party of the second part, and his heirs and assigns forever, so that neither the said parties of the first part, nor their heirs, nor any other person or persons for them or in their stead or behalf, shall or will hereafter claim or demand any right or title to the aforesaid premises, or any part thereof, they and every of them, or heirs, or assigns, present, or expected, and forever barred. We witness, whereof, the said parties of the first part
