Fuller, the receipt thereof being hereby acknowledged & hereby grant bargain, sell and convey unto the said R. W. Fuller and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the City of Juba, Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit: Lot 20 eleven (11) in block No. three (3) Third & D. Gillette addition to Juba, Ind. Ter.

To have and to hold the same unto the said R. W. Fuller, and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging. And hereby covenants with the said R. W. Fuller that we will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatsoever.

And I, Lucy B. Stout, wife of the said Willie C. Stout for and in consideration of the said sum of money do hereby release and relinquish unto the said R. W. Fuller all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
