We, Legue C. Perryman, Samuel C. Davis and Ruben L. Partidge being first duly sworn, depose and state that we were well acquainted with Ida Scott, now deceased, during her lifetime; that we knew her father and mother and her entire family and know that at the time of her death she left surviving her father and her mother, Nora Scott, formerly Nora Perryman, that the father of the said Ida Scott died after her death and she left surviving her no brothers or sisters; that the said Ida Scott left no grandfather or grandmother or uncle or aunt on her father's side, except Sunday Scott, a brother of Andy Scott, deceased, and that the said Nora Burgess and Sunday Scott are the only living heirs at law of the said Ida Scott, deceased. That the said Ida Scott died intestate and was at the time of her death a citizen by blood of the Creek Nation, Indian Territory.

That the said Sunday Scott was the full uncle of Ida Scott, deceased, being a brother of Andy Scott, the deceased father of the said Ida Scott, deceased, and that the said Ida Scott died without issue of body and without ever having been married, and that the said Nora Burgess and Sunday Scott are the only surviving heirs at law of the said Ida Scott, deceased.
