Know all Men By These Presents, that Martha J. Blackwood party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of thirty dollars to her in hand paid by W. A. Graham, of Pryor Creek, D.S., party of the second part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, has this day granted, Bargained and sold and by these presents does hereby Grant, Bargain, sell and convey to the said party of the second part certain lands and premises situate, lying and being in the Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, to-wit: An undivided one-eighth (1/8) interest in and to the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4; N 1/2 of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4; and the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4, of section thirty (30), township 29 north, range 14 east of the Indian Meridian, containing seventy acres more or less, and being the allotment of Nancy H. H. H., deceased.

To have and to hold unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever together with all and singular the rights, appurtenances and muniments thereto belonging. And the said party of the first part covenants with said second party, his heirs and assigns, that the aforesaid Nancy H. H. H. is now deceased, leaving surviving her as her sole and only heirs at law, Nathaniel H. H., her son, Rebecca L. H., her daughter and the children of Amy Catherine Thompson (the said Amy Thompson, deceased being a daughter of the said Nancy H. H. H.) and who are Arthur Blair, this grantor, John L. Thompson, Ellie Thompson, Nathaniel Thompson and Earl Thompson; and that as such grand daughter of the aforesaid allottee, this grantor is the owner of an undivided one-eighth (1/8) interest in the aforesaid lands which said lands and premises are free from incumbrances, and title to which the grantor well and her heirs and administrators shall forever warrant to defend.
