Warranty Deed.

Know All Men By These Presents, that Oliver N. Thompson of Dakota Indian Territory party of the first part, for and in consideration of thirty (\$30.00) dollars to him in hand paid by W. A. Graham of Big Horn Indian Territory party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has this day and date by these presents hereby Grant, Bargain, Sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part certain lands and premises lying in the Twenty Eighth (28) Recording District, Cherokee Nation Indian Territory, to-wit: An undivided one eighteenth (18th) interest in the North East Quarter (NE 1/4) of the North East Quarter (NE 1/4); the North half (N 1/2) of the South East Quarter (SE 1/4) of the North East Quarter (NE 1/4) and the the North East Quarter (NE 1/4) of the North West Quarter (NW 1/4) of the North East Quarter (NE 1/4) of Section Thirty (30), Township twenty three (23) North, Range fourteen (14) East of the Indian Base and Meridian, containing twenty (20) acres more or less, being the Cherokee allotment of Nancy Lial, deceased.

To Have And To Hold, the said bargained lands unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever in fee simple, together with all and singular the rights, appurtenances, and improvements thereto belonging. And the said party of the first part covenants with the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns that the aforesaid Nancy Lial is now deceased, leaving surviving her as her sole and only heir Nathaniel H. Lial, her son, Rebecca Toplin, her daughter, and the children of Arny or Arny Catherine Thompson deceased, who was a daughter of the said Nancy Lial, the children of the said Arny or Arny Catherine Thompson being Arthur Blair, Martha J. Blackwood, John L. Thompson, Oliver N. Thompson, Nathaniel Thompson and Earl Thompson, and that the said party of the first part is Oliver N. Thompson, son of the aforesaid Arny Catherine Thompson deceased, and owner of an undivided one eighteenth (18th) interest in and to the lands and premises, aforesaid; that the said party of the first part is an unmarried man and that the said lands are free of incumbrance, and that he will, and his his heirs administrators and executors shall forever warrant and defend the title thereto against the lawful claims of all persons whatever.
