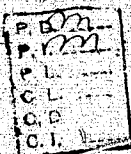

R. Evans and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lots, in the Town of Juntura, Creek Nation, Western District, Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots No. Five (5) Block No. Two (2) and Lot Twelve (12) Block No. Eleven (11) according to the survey and plat filed thereof.

To have and to hold the same unto the said grantee and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging.

And hereby covenants with said grantee that it will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.
