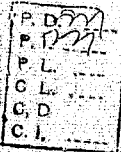

I have and do hold the same unto the said grantee and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said grantee that it will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.
