General Warranty Deed.

This Indenture, made and entered into this 9th day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five by and between Willie Alexander and Nancy Alexander of Ky., and Amos Henry of Broken Arrow, Ind., parties of the first part, and Amos Henry of Broken Arrow, Ind., party of the second part.

Witnesseth: that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty Four Hundred Forty one \$ Dollars, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto said party of the second part the following described real estate and premises situate in the Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The North half of the North West quarter of Section Thirteen in Township eighteen north and Range Thirteen east of the Indian Base and Meridian in Indian Territory containing eighty acres more or less, together with all things firm unto them, and appurtenances and immunities thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto, and warrant the title to the same, subject to any valid existing lease now on the premises.

And, Nancy Alexander, wife of the said Willie Alexander for and in consideration of the said sum of money do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands, so have and to hold the said lands unto the said party of the second part, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever.
