W. E. Rolider,

This indenture, made this 16th day of February, 1902, between the First National Bank of Tulsa, Indian Territory, party of the first part, and W. E. Rolider of Tulsa, Indian Territory, party of the second part;

Witnesseth, that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has demised, released, sold, conveyed and quit claimed, and by these presents does demise, release, sell, convey and quit claim unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever, all the right, title, interest, claim and demand which said party of the first part has in and to the following lands lying and situate within the Creek Nation, Western District of the Indian Territory, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:-

One undivided one-half interest in and to lots numbered one (1), two (2) and three (3), in block numbered twenty-nine (29), town of Tulsa, Indian Territory, according to the official record plat thereof.

To Have and to Hold the same, together with all and singular the appurtenances and privileges thereto belonging or appertaining, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatever of the said party of the first part, within law or in equity, to the only purpose, benefit and behoof of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever.

In Witness Whereof, said First National Bank has, in pursuance of a resolution of its Board of Directors, caused this deed to be subscribed by its President, and caused its corporate seal to be attached thereto, attested by its Secretary all on the day and year first above written.
