Oil and Gas Lease

This Lease made between Bessie B. Logsdon party of the first part, and Charles Page party of the second part, Witnesseth, that in consideration of Forty (\$40.00) dollars the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said party of the first part hereby agrees with the party of the second part: that he shall have the exclusive right for seven years from this date to enter upon and operate for Oil or Gas on all of that certain tract of land in Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, described as follows: N 1/4 of N 1/4 Section Twenty Township Twenty Range Fourteen Acres 40. Containing 40 acres, more or less, upon the following terms and conditions: Second part... shall deliver in tanks at the wells of the first party without cost, one-tenth of all Oil produced on these premises, and pay the market price in cash for the same if the first party, shall so desire, and One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) dollars per annum for gas, as long as this same is being sold off the premises. And second party to pay all damages of any kind that may arise by reason of their operations thereon. If Oil or Gas is found in paying quantities in any well drilled, the privilege of operating shall continue as long as Oil or Gas shall be produced in paying quantities, and when abandoned for such purposes this grant shall cease and shall no longer be binding on either party. If Gas is found on the above described land, the party of the first part to have the use of the same for domestic purposes free. The second part reserves the right to remove all machinery and fixtures fenced thereon by them. This lease shall become absolutely null and void after one year unless the second party, shall elect from year to year to continue this lease by paying or depositing to the credit of the first party an annual rental of one dollar per acre at First National Bank of Tulsa, Indian Territory, as rental, said rental to be deposited on or before the 5th day of October, each year.

It is understood by and between the first and second parties to this agreement that all conditions between the first and second parties herein shall extend to their heirs, executors and assigns.
