Know all Men By these Presents: That I Alongo Ward of Tulsa, Indian Territory, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and other good and valuable considerations by me had and received have this day and by these presents do bargain, sell and convey to N. A. McKeever and W. W. Wharton, both of Tulsa, Indian Territory, the following described property, to-wit:

1 gray horse, branded O on left hip, byears old, weighing about 900 pounds, named Tip, 1 gray horse, branded O on left hip, weighing about 950 pounds, named Tip, 1 brown horse, weighing about 1500 pounds, named Button, 1 sorrel horse, weighing about 900 pounds, named Bowley, 1 Wagon, 1 double set of harness, 1 walking cultivator, 1 two-seated carriage.

D. 1902, by and between Alongo Ward of Tulsa, Indian Territory, party of the first part, and N. A. McKeever and W. W. Wharton, both of Tulsa, Indian Territory, parties of the second part.

Witnesseth: That in consideration of the parties of the second part having this day advanced the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to attorneys for the party of the first part, the said party of the first part agree to give the parties of the second part a mortgage on whatever lands he files upon in the Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, as security for money which they have this day advanced and which they may advance under this contract.
