Warranty Deed.

This Indenture, Made this thirteenth day of February, A.D. 1907, between Newton Walker, a singleman, of Muskogee, Indian Territory, as party of the first part, and Richard W. Adams of Washington, D.C. as party of the second part, Witnesseth, that the party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars to him in hand paid by said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has sold, and by these presents does hereby give, grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, in fee simple forever (an undivided one-fifth interest in that certain tract of land, situated in the Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, described as the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter and the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section four in township twenty north and range thirteen east) together with all and singular the privileges, improvements, tenements, buildings and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, with all the estate, title, and interest of said party of the first part therein, and the said party of the first part hereby covenants with the said party of the second part that he is seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein, and has a lawful right to sell and convey the same; that there are no liens or mortgages on said property of any kind or nature whatever; and the said party of the first part hereby covenants and agrees with said party of the second part that he will, and his heirs, executors and administrators shall forever warrant and defend the title to the said lands, against all lawful and equitable claims and demands whatsoever.
