

Articles of Agreement & Incorporation

of

Know All Men By These Presents.

That the Incorporators hereinafter named have this day associated themselves together & by these presents formed a corporation under & pursuant to the provisions of an act of Congress approved February 18 1901 entitled "An Act to put in force in the Indian Territory certain provisions of the laws of Arkansas relating to Corporations & to make said provisions applicable to said Territory" which said act provides for the formation of Corporations for the purpose of engaging in or carrying on any kind of manufacturing, mechanical, mining or other lawful business & in evidence thereof do hereby execute the following Articles of Incorporation.

I
The name of said corporation shall be
Indua Portland Cement Company.

II

The names of the Incorporators are D. L. Shephard, Gray Crichton, H. C. Aikby, A. C. Shigler, W. L. Dickey, George J. Bayne, John O. Mitchell, A. W. Sefton, Bucke Enck, J. A. McLeod, & Wm. O. Hawley.

III

The place of business of said corporation shall be or near Indua Indian Territory State of Oklahoma, & its office for the transaction of business shall be in said City of Indua. Said office is to be the registered office of said corporation and corporation may also have its office or an office for the transaction of business in Kansas City, Missouri, & at such other place or places as the Board of Directors of said corporation may select.

The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by this corporation & the objects for which it is formed are:

To make & manufacture cement of all kinds and to sell & to dispose of the same, to mine quarry & transport rock & shale & sand & all other materials entering into the manufacture & composition of cement & any or all
