Warranty Deed.

Know All Men by These Presents: That we, Olla M. Henry and Lewis M. Henry, heirs of Nancy Harkay of Neer Creek Nation, Indian Territory, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty Eight Hundred Dollars, to them paid by Fred Bukey receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Fred Bukey his heirs and assigns forever, the following described lot or parcel of ground, lying and being situate in the Creek Nation of the Indian Territory to wit:

The south west quarter of Section Twenty in Township eighteen north and range Fourteen east of the Indian Base and Meridian in Indian Territory containing one hundred sixty acres more or less.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Fred Bukey his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging. And we Olla M. Henry and Lewis M. Henry hereby covenant with the said Fred Bukey that said lands are free from incumbrances, that we will forever warrant and defend the title to said lands against all lawful claims whatever.

And I Olla M. Henry, wife of the said Lewis M. Henry for and in consideration of said sum of money, do hereby release unto the said Fred Bukey all my right of dower and Homestead in and to said lands.
