This indenture, made and entered into on this 24th day of June, 1907, by and between W. Tom Logan and Mary Logan his wife of Muskogee, I.T., parties of the first part, and Connell Rogers of Ft. Gibson, I.T., party of the second part;

Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) to me in hand paid by the said party of the second part, and other good and valuable considerations, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part, his heirs, administrators, executors and assigns, all of the following described real estate and premises, to-wit:

A part of Lot number sixteen (16) in Block thirty three (33) described as all that part of lot number sixteen (16) which lies west of a line which is parallel with and 36 feet west of the east line of said lot number sixteen (16) according to the official plat of the town of Muskogee I.T.

Lots 13, 14, and 15 in Block No. Eleven (11) in the town of Broken Arrow I.T. together with all the improvements and immunities thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and warrant the title to the same.

And I Mary G. Logan, wife of the said W. Tom Logan, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to said land. This conveyance is made upon the following conditions, to-wit:

Whereas, the said party of the second part, at the request and for the benefit of the said part - of the first part, has on the day and year first herein above written, endorsed and secured the payment of a certain promissory note made by the said part - of the first part, for the sum of Two thousand and 25/100 Dollars bearing date of June 24th, 1907, and payable six months after date to the order of Farmers National Bank, Ft. Gibson Ind. Ter., at its banking office in Ft. Gibson, —;

Now, therefore, This conveyance is intended to secure the party of the second part for all principal, interest, money, costs, charges, and expenses which he may be compelled to pay in
