Deed of Release.

Thomas Beerley et al.

Know all men by these presents, That the Union Trust Company (an Indian Territory Corporation) of Tulsa Ind. Ter. for and in consideration of the sum of Eleven Hundred \$100 Dollars, to it paid by Thomas Beerley and Belle B. Beerley do hereby grant, sell, quitclaim and release unto the said Thomas Beerley and Belle B. Beerley and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following described real estate lying in the Western District of the Indian Territory to-wit: Beginning at a point on the North line of Lot one (1) twenty five (25) feet west of the Northeast corner of said lot, thence west along said lot line twenty five (25) feet to a point on said lot line, thence in a southerly direction parallel with the alley line twenty eight (28) feet to a point on the south line of said lot one (1), thence easterly along said lot line twenty five (25) feet to a point on said lot line, thence in a northerly course on a line parallel with said alley line to the place of beginning, all in Lot One (1) of Block One hundred Eighteen (118) Tulsa Ind. Ter. This deed being made to release (only so far as it effects the above described property) the lien of a certain mortgage dated July 16th 1906 and recorded July 20th, 1906 at 3.30 P.M. in Book 1 at Page 44 of the records of Mortgages at Tulsa Ind. Ter.

This deed of Release is made by the undersigned officer of the Union Trust Company in pursuance of the authority conferred upon him in Article VII of the bylaws of said Company, as follows:

The Secretary shall have equal power with the President to satisfy and release mortgages judgments or certificates of trust to execute contracts, release or other instruments in the transaction of the company's business.
