George Smith, Betsey Smith, Wilson Smith, Margaret Kingfisher and Sallie Smith, being first duly sworn according to law on oath say: that one Johnson Smith, deceased was a citizen of the Cherokee Nation, by blood, duly enrolled on the citizenship roll of said Nation, and as such was allotted his proportionate share of the lands of the said Cherokee Nation, and a certificate of allotment issued to him on April 20th 1903, by the Commission of the Five Civilized Tribes, to the following described lands in the said Cherokee Nation, Northern District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: East half of the North West Fourth of Section Ten (10) Township twenty two (22) North, Range Thirteen (13) East.

That on or about the fourteenth day of November 1904 said Johnson Smith died, at Tahlequah, Northern District, Indian Territory, possessed of all the above described lands, leaving surviving him one child, to-wit: Lula Smith, his only and sole issue and heir at law and Charlotte Smith, his wife,

That on or about the - day of March, 1905, said Charlotte Smith, widow of Johnson Smith, deceased, and mother of said Lula Smith, died intestate at Tahlequah, I.T., leaving her said minor son as her only issue and heir at law surviving her.

That on the second day of August 1905, said Lula Smith aforesaid died intestate and without issue, leaving surviving him as his sole and only heirs at law: George Smith and Betsey Smith, his grandfather and grandmother, and Margaret Kingfisher - nee - Smith, aged 30 years, and Sallie Smith aged 24, sisters of the whole blood of Johnson Smith, deceased, and aunts of said Lula Smith deceased, and Wilson Smith, aged 26, Daniel Smith aged 20 years, and Levi Smith aged 12 years, brothers of the whole blood of said Johnson Smith, deceased, and uncles of said Lula Smith aforesaid.

That said George Smith and Sallie Smith, and Daniel Smith and Levi Smith above named are enrolled on the citizenship roll of the Cherokee Nation as less than full bloods and that Betsey Smith, Margaret Smith Kingfisher - nee - Smith, and Wilson Smith are enrolled as full bloods.

Affiants as aforesaid, say that the said George Smith grandfather, Betsey Smith, grandmother, Wilson Smith, Daniel Smith and Levi Smith, uncles and Sallie Smith, Margaret Kingfisher - nee - Smith, aunts, comprise all and the only and sole heirs of said Lula Smith, and have a ^{complete title} full and perfect right to sell and convey the same.
