Okla. Oil Company.

Deed.

This Indenture, Made This 29th day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seven, between The Associated Producers Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Pennsylvania, party of the first part, and The Okla. Oil Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Indian Territory, party of the second part,

Witnesseth, ^{that} The said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar, to it duly paid before the delivery hereof, has bargained and sold, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and convey, to the party of the second part, its successors, vendees and assigns forever, all those pieces, parcels and tracts of land situate, lying and being in the Creek Nation, Indian Territory, and described as follows:

First: The South one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of Southwest one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 15, and North one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of Northwest one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 22, all in Township 17 North, Range 12 East of the Indian Base and Meridian, containing One hundred and sixty (160) acres, more or less, known as the Elijah Corboay Farm, and being the same parcel of land conveyed to David D. Connolly and Ella C. Connolly, his wife, to Associated Producers Company by Deed dated May 29th, 1906, and recorded in the Clerk's office at Sapulpa, Indian Territory, in Book No. 11, page 500;

Second: The Southwest one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 14, and the Southeast one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 15, all in Township 17 North, Range 12 East of the Indian Base and Meridian, containing Three hundred and twenty (320) acres, more or less, and subject to any valid existing lease for oil and gas now on the said Southeast one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of
