

Deed of Release

I now all men by these presents:

That the Union Trust Company an Indian Territory Corporation of Tulsa Oklahoma for and in consideration of ^{seven} ~~ten~~ Thousand 700 dollars to it paid by George E. Bayne does hereby grant sell - quit - claim and release unto the said George E. Bayne & Mabel P. Bayne his wife and unto their heirs and assigns forever the following described real-estate lying in the Tulsa County Oklahoma formerly western District of the Indian Territory to-wit:-

Part of Lot seven (7), in Block One Hundred four (104) in Tulsa Oklahoma more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the south easterly corner of Block one hundred four (104), thence in a westerly direction seventy-five feet 75' parallel with south third street, thence northerly fifty (50) feet parallel with south main street, thence easterly seventy-five (75) feet and parallel with south third street; thence southerly fifty (50) feet and parallel with south main street to place of beginning and being a plot 50 x 75 feet in the southeasterly corner of Block one hundred four (104), having a frontage of 50 feet on south main ^{street} and being 75 feet deep in the original town of Tulsa Indian Territory according to the official plat thereof.

This deed being made to release only so far as it affects the above described property, the lien of a certain mortgage dated October 2nd, 1907 and recorded November 3rd, 1907 at 3 P.M. in Book 11 at Page 42 of the records of mortgages at Tulsa Ind. Terr.

This deed of release is made by the undersigned officers of the Union Trust Company in pursuance of the authority conferred upon him in article VII of the bylaws of said Company as follows:

The secretary shall have equal power with the president to satisfy and release mortgages judgments or ~~certificates~~ of trust to execute contracts,
