

Payments for the coal taken from said land are to be made on the first day of each month for all coal taken out during the preceding month.

It is understood and agreed that parties of the second part shall not be required to take out and pay for coal lying deeper than twenty five feet in the ground unless they desire to do so, but they have the option to take coal lying deeper than twenty five feet if they so desire.

And I, Carrie McCoy for the above considerations hereby release all my right or dower in and to the coal underlying that portion of the above described land belonging to Waddie McCoy.
