 for buildings located there and occupied as
 houses and dwelling houses by a population
 of about four hundred people. It also appears
 from the report that the petitioner is
 quite intelligent and apparently fully competent
 to manage her own business affairs. He is of the opinion
 that it would be to her best interest to permit her
 to operate her business in Toronto in order
 for the reason that she can escape much more
 from the land by selling it in lots and have
 her money for use to which it might be
 put. The office concurs in the recommendation
 of Acting Commissioner Pearson that the unvested
 claimants of Whitchurch be authorized, and that the
 petitioner, Misses P. Stewart be permitted to convey
 and plot her land and sell it in lots and
 blocks for private purposes at Liverpool, Luck
 Wilton.
