

Articles of Agreement and Incorporation.

Of The Tulsa Addition Company.

Know all Men By These Presents:

That the Corporators hereinafter named have this day and by these presents, formed a Corporation under and in pursuance of an Act of Congress approved February 18th 1901, entitled "An Act to put in force in the Indian Territory certain provisions of the Laws of Arkansas relating to Corporations and to make said provisions applicable to said Territory," which said Act provides for incorporation for manufacturing and other lawful business purposes in the Indian Territory, and in evidence thereof do hereby execute the following

Articles of Incorporation:

First: The name of said Corporation shall be The Tulsa Addition.

Second: The Corporators are Laurence A. Owens, Carl C. Magee and A. Miller Hammett.

Third: The place of business is to be located at Tulsa, Indian Territory and its offices for the transaction of business shall be in the office of Carl C. Magee or at such other place as the Board of Directors may select.

Fourth: The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted by this Corporation is to buy and sell real estate; to take land by deed in fee simple, lease or otherwise, and to own the same in its own right; to make deeds, mortgages, notes, contracts or other instruments; to buy, sell or discount notes, mortgages or other instruments and to endorse the same; to take or give oil and gas or agricultural leases; to drill for oil and gas or to make contracts for such drilling; to own and operate gas, electric light or brick plants; to lay pipe lines and to do any and all things incident thereto.
