

Clarence L. Leede. } Bill of Sale.
 To Frank E. Duncan. } This agreement made and
 entered into this day of
 December, 1907, by and between Clarence L. Leede, of
 Tulsa, Oklahoma, party of the first part, and Frank
 E. Duncan, of Tulsa, Oklahoma, party of the second
 part, witnessed:

That for and in consideration of the sum of
 Six hundred (\$600.00) Dollars, in hand paid, receipt
 thereof being hereby acknowledged, the said party of
 the first part sells, transfers and conveys unto the
 said party of the second part, the personal property here-
 in after mentioned to wit:

Arkansas Reports, Sixty-six Volumes, Digest of
 same, Two Volumes, General Digest, Sixteen Volumes,
 American and English Encyclopaedia of Law, Thirty-
 one Volumes, Pleading and Practice, Twenty-three Volumes,
 United States Circuit Court Reports, Eighty-one Volumes,
 Southeastern Reporter, Forty-one Volumes, American and
 English Railway Cases, new Series, Twenty-four Volumes,
 American and English Railway Cases, Sixty-two Volumes,
 Fifty Volumes Miscellaneous Books, Binding text books,
 Codes and Digests, one iron safe, Fifty Globe Wernicke
 cases, ten tops and ten bottoms, two desks, one roll top
 and one flat top, one Brussels rug, one linoleum rug,
 one library table, seven chairs, one filing case and
 stand, two stoves, five window shades and one lot
 gas fixtures.

It is agreed and understood by these presents
 that the actual delivery and possession of said personal
 property is placed in said party of the second part. The
