In Trust Nevertheless for the purposes of securi  $\epsilon$  the performance of the covenants and agreements herein .

Whereas the grantors Mary M Barber and John W Barberare justly indebted upon their principal promissory note abearing even date herewith payable to their on order and by them endorsed and delivered for the sum of One Hundred F orty eight and /0/T00 Dollars payable in installments one for \$ 3.10 due on the first day of December A.D.1908 and five for \$ 28.00 each due seriatim annually thereafter each of said installments being payable at the office of Pearson & Taft in Chicago, Illinois and bearing interest after maturity at the rate of 10 % per annum.

The Grantors covenant and agree as follows .

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FIRST: To pay said indebtednes: and the interest thereon as herein and in said notes provided, or according to any agreement extending the time feet payment.

SECOND: To pay before delinquency all taxes and assessments by or in the State of Oklahoma against said principal examples or gainst the interest of the grantee or his successors therein from against this Trust Deed or the money or indebtedness secured hereby, with out regard to any law hereotofore or hereafter enacted imposing payment of the whole or any part thereof upon the grantee or his successors or the holder of the notes hereby secured and on such payment to submit to the grantee or his successor or receipts therefor.

THIRD: To commit / pormit no waste upon said premises .

In the event of the failure to pay taxes or assessments the grantee or his successor or the holder of said indebtedness may pay such taxes or assessments or discharge or pyrchase any tax lien or title affecting said premises; and all money so paid and the cost of any insura nce so procured, grantors agree to repay immediately without demark; and the same and any other moneys disburded by the holder of said indebtedness to protect the lien hereof with interest from the date of payment at the rate of 10% per kknix annum, shall be so much additional indebtedness secured hereby.
