FOURTH: The lessee further agrees to have pipe lines for oil in cultivated fields below plow depth when requested to do so by the lessor, and to pay for damage done to growing crops while drilling.

FIFTH: The lessee agrees not to drill any wells within 250 feet of any building on said premises without the written consent of the lessor.

FURTHERMORE, The lessor hereby releases and waives all rights under and by virtue of the homestead exemption laws of this state as athey may effect said premises. And the lessor also consents to the lessee selling and disposing of said lease.

FURTHERMORE, it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the lessee shall have the right to use gas, oil and water produced on said lands for its operations thereon or other lands near lease except water from the wells of lessor.

It is agreed that all the terms and conditions hereof shall extend to and apply to the heirs, executors, administrators and assigns of the parties hereto.
