On this 7th, day of December, 1908, comes on for hearing the petition of Thomas Williams bearing date Exof the Friday of December 1909 To said and Sanuel K. Todd for the approval of deed executed by Said Thomas Williams and Samuel K. Todd for the interest of said Thomas Williams in the allotment of Mary Spybuck, deceased, and the Court having seen said retion and heard the testimony of the petitioners, and also of S. R. Lewis and D. W. Tyner, witnesses, in open court in relation thereto, doth find as follows:

That one mary Spybuck departed this life intestate, without issue on the <u>day of</u> 1904, about ten miles north of Tulsa, in the Cherokee Nation, Northern District, Indian Territory, in what is now part of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma; that said Mary Spybuck was a Citizen by blood of the Cherokee Nation or tribe of Indians, and was duly enrolled by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes as a full-blood Indian, and that her name appears afrond upon the roll of Cherokee Indians epposite No. 30173.

That there was selected for and allotted to the said Mary Spybuck, as and for her share of the lands of the Cherokee Nation, the following described lands, to wit:

 $N_2^1$  of the SW4 of Section 18, Township 21 N., Range 13 E., in Tulsa County, Oklahoma.  $d_{a}L_{a}$ That the said Mary Spybuck at the time of ber death left her surviving as her sole and only heirs at law the following named persons, to wit:

Thomas Williams, nephew and petitioner herein, and George Daugherty and Howard Daugherty, grand-nephews; that all of said heirs are full-blood indians.

That the restrictions upon the alienation of inherited lands of allottees of the Cherokee Nation were removed by Act of Congress approved May 27, 1908, but that said act provided among other things that no conveyance of any interest of any full-blood heir in such land shall be valid undess approved by the court having jurisdiction of the settlement of the estat of the deceased allottee.
