IN THE MATTER OF THE ALIENATION OF THE ALLOTMENT OF THOMAS ADAMS, DECEASED, BY SAMUEL C. ADAMS AND ANNIE T. ADAMS AND SALINA HARJO FIFE, NEE SEBERT, AND ROBERT FIFE, HER HUSBAND, AS HEIRS AT LAW.

O R D E R.

This matter came on to be heard upon this, the 1st, day of October, 1908, upon the petition of Charles Page, asking for an order of this Court approving certain deeds, below described, made, executed and delivered to his petitioner by Samuel C. Adams and Salina Harjo Fife, nee Sebert, as the heirs at law of the said Thomas Adams, deceased.

Said petitioner appearing by his attorneys Abbot & Brown, and the Court, after hearing the testimony of witnesses and examining the documentary evidence produced on the hearing, and being fully advised in the premises, doth find:

FIRST: That the allegations in said petition contained are true.

SECOND: That the said Thomas Adams, deceased, was a full blood Creek Indian, and duly enrolled as such, that by reason thereof, there was allotted to him, as his distributive share of the lands of the Creek Nation, the following described lands, situate in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to wit:

The Southwest Quarter of Section 12, Township 19 North, Range 11 East. and that the said Thomas Adams, deceased, died possessed of the lands above described on or about theday of19....and at the time of his death was a resident of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, that the said deceased died intestate and had no issue born to him after the 4th, day of March 1906.

THIRD: That the said Samuel C. Adams and the said Salina Harjo Fife, nee Sebert, are brother & half sister of the said Thomas Adams, deceased, and heirs at law of the said deceased and are full blood Creek Indians.

FOURTH: That on the 23rd, day of May, 1908, the said Samuel C. Adams made, executed and delivered to the said petitioner, Charles Page, a warranty deed, conveying an undivided one-half interest in and to the land above described, which said deed is of record in the office of the Register of Deeds, of Tulsa County, in Deed Record No. 35 and at Page 536, thereof; that on the 26th, day of May, 1908, the said Salina Harjo Fife, nee Sebert, made, executed and delivered to the said Charles Page a warranty deed, conveying an undivided one-half interest in and to the land above described, which said deed is of record in the office of the Register of Deeds, of Tulsa County, in Deed Record No. 35, at page 535, thereof.

FIFTH: That on the 1st, day of August, 1908, a decree issued from the District Court of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, and by the Honorable L. M. Poe, Judge of the said Court, quieting the title to said land in the said Charles Page and barring all claims or demands of the said Samuel C. Adams and the said Salina Harjo Fife, nee Sebert, with reference to said land.

SIXTH: That on the 31st, day of August 1908, the said Samuel C. Adams, together with Annie T. Adams, his wife, and as an heir at law of the said Thomas Adams, deceased, made, executed and delivered to the said Charles Page and for a valuable consideration, a new deed conveying an undivided one-half interest in and to the land above described to the said petitioner, Charles Page which said deed was filed for record September 2, 1908, in the office of the Register of Deeds of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and recorded in record No. 45, at page 462 thereof; and on the 2nd day of September, 1908 the said Salina Harjo Fife, nee Sebert, together with Robert Fife, her husband, as one of the heirs at law of the said Thomas Adams, deceased, made, executed and delivered, and for a good and valuable consideration, to the said Charles Page
