That the allegations of the petition are true; that the said McDora Jefferson was a full blood Creek Indian, duly enrolled as such and was allotted the following described lands, situated in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to wit:

The Southeast Quarer of the Northeast Quarter and the North Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 23, and the Bast Twenty Acfes of the West Half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 23, and the North Half of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 24, all in Township lyohth Range 11 East. And that the said McDora Jefferson died seized of the saidlands on or about the Day of 1906, was a resident of Tulsa County, at the time of her deab was the daughter of these petitioners and there have been no childred born to her dince the 4th, day of March 1906.

That the said McDora Jefferson and leaving surviviring her these pet itioners, who are her farther and mother, and one brother and one sister, as her sole and only heir at law, and that these petitioners are fill blood Creek Indians.
