ORDER OF COURT.

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF TULSA COUNTY,

STATE OF OKLAHOMA

IN THE MATTER OF THE ALIENATION OF THE ALLOTMENT OF McDORA JEFFERSON BY MOSES JEFFERSON AND NANCY

JEFFERSON, AS HEIRS.

O R D E R.

This matter came on to be heard on this the 1st, day of October, 1908, upon the petition of Moses Jefferson and Nancy Jefferson, as the father and mother of the said McDora Jefferson deceased, asking for an order of court approving a certain deed conveying the allotment of the said deceased, to Charles Page and R. E. Josey

Said petitioners appearing in person and by their attorneys, Abbot & Brown, and after hearing the testimony of the petitioners, and the argument of counsel and the Court being fully advised in the premises, finds:

That the allegations of the petition are true; that the said McDora Jefferson was a full blood Creek Indian, duly enrolled as such and was allotted the following described lands, situated in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to wit:

The Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter and the North Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 23, and the East Twenty Acres of the West Half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 23, and the North Half of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of Section 24, all in Township 1 North Range 11 East. And that the said McDora Jefferson died seized of the said lands on or about the Day of 1906, was a resident of Tulsa County, at the time of her death was the daughter of these petitioners and there have been no children born to her since the 4th, day of March 1906.

That the said McDora Jefferson ^{did} ~~was~~ leaving surviving her these petitioners, who are her father and mother, and one brother and one sister, as her sole and only heir at law, and that these petitioners are all blood Creek Indians.
