ORDER OF CONFIRMATION

It appearing to the Court at a hearing on the 17th day of June 1908, that on the 5th day of June 1908, Emily M Campbell, executrix in the above entitled cause, filed her petition in this Court praying for the confirmation of the sale of the land herein described; and,

It further appearing to the court that on the said 5th day of June 1908 the Court made an order setting the 17th day of June 1908, for the hearing of said petition and in said order required the publication of a notice of said hearing for a period of ten days previous to the said 17th day of June 1908, ; and,

It further appearing to the Court that under the terms of the will of the above named decedent, the said will having been admitted to probate in this Court on the 10th day of December 1907, the executrix Emily M Campbell, the petitioner aforementioned, was authorized and empowered to sell and dispose of any and all of the real estate of the said decedent as to her seemed fit and proper; and,

It further appearing to the Court that in accordance with said power and authority given in said will, the said executrix, Emily M Campbell, sold to C.H. Hancock, Lot 8 in Block I of the Drew Addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, for the sum of \$ 500; and,

It further appearing to the Court that no special mode of sale was required by said will of the said decedent and that said sale was legally made and fairly conducted; that the sum paid was more than 90% of the appraised value of said lot, and that no greater sum than above specified could be obtained; and,

It further appearing to the Court that the said executrix filed her return of said proceedings of said sale on the said 5th day of June 1908, as stated herein; and,

It further having been proved to the satisfaction of this Court that pursuant to the order of this Court made on the 5th day of June 1908, and the statutes of Oklahoma in such cases made and provided, there was published in the Tulsa Daily Democrat a newspaper published in the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, for a period of ten days a notice that the executrix would on the said 17th day of June 1908 apply for the confirmation of the said sale of the said property herein described; and,

It further having been proved to the satisfaction of this Court that the said notice properly described the lands herein mentioned, properly stated the price for which the same was sold, and in all ways conformed to the order of this Court and the Statutes of Oklahoma; and,

It further having been proved to the satisfaction of this Court by the affidavit of William Stryker, editor and publisher of the said Tulsa Daily Democrat, that the said notice was published the time required by the said order and Statute; and,

It further appearing to the Court that the said sale has been made in conformity to the provisions of the Statutes in such cases made and provided:
