-----: LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF WILBUR EMORY CAMPBELL :-----

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That I, Wilbur Emory Campbell, of Tulsa Indian Territory, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make, seal, publish and declare this as my last will and testament, hereby revoking all prior wills, testaments and codicils.

FIRST: To my beloved wife Emily M Campbell, I hereby give, and bequeathe all my personal estate of whatever kinds and descriptions, after the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses.

SECOND: To my Beloved Wife Emily M Campbell, I hereby give, devise and bequeathe my dwelling house and lands on which the same shall be situate at my death, whether in Tulsa, Indian Territory or elsewhere, she to take a Life Estate therein, and have full control thereof and the income therefrom during her life.

THIRD: To my Daughter Gladys Elizabeth Campbell I give, devise and bequeathe in fee simple the dwelling house and lands above mentioned subject only to her mother's Life Estate and my said Daughter to come into full possession of said property upon the termination of her Mother's Estate. I hereby direct that the same shall be and remain her individual and <sup>separate</sup> ~~separate~~ property, separate and apart from her husband should she hereafter be married, said property to be controlled as she may desire and direct.

FOURTH: It is my wish and direction that my Beloved Wife Emily M Campbell shall have full control over all my estate, Real, Personal or mixed, except that mentioned in Article Three, with full power of sale and disposal and that the remainder of any of said property at her death shall be divided equally among my six children to-wit: Wilbur Denton Campbell, Robert Boyers Campbell, Charles Duncan Campbell, Roy Hamilton Campbell, Frank Lee Campbell and Gladys Elizabeth Campbell. But I hereby empower my Beloved wife Emily M Campbell to make such equitable division of my property among said children, during her life time as she may from time to time desire.

FIFTH: I hereby appoint my Beloved wife Emily M Campbell <sup>as sole</sup> ~~as sole~~ Executrix of this my last will and testament, and I further direct that she be required to furnish no bond whatsoever.
