This Indenture,

Made this 24th day of November, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and eight, by and between Edward F. Hammond and Vera Hammond, his wife, and James M. Woodford and Julia M. Woodford, his wife of the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, parties of the first part and Lee Clinton, parties of the second part.

WITNESSETH, That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty eight hundred and no/100 Dollars, to them in hand paid, by the said parties of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm, unto said parties of the second part, and to their heirs and assigns, forever, all of the following described tract, piece or parcel of land lying and situate in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The east 5 feet of lot four and the east 5 feet of the south half of lot five in Block eighty five in the city of Tulsa, Oklahoma according to the official plat thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME, With all and singular, the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and all rights of homestead exemption, unto the said parties of the second part, and to their heirs and assigns forever. And the said parties of the first part do hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof they are the lawful owners of the premises above granted, and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein free and clear of all incumbrances, and that they will warrant and defend the same in the quiet and peaceable possession of said parties of the second part.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, And this instrument is made, executed and delivered upon the following conditions to-wit:

FIRST: Said Edward F. Hammond and Vera Hammond, his wife and James M. Woodford and Julia M. Woodford, his wife, have justly indebted unto the said parties of the second part in the principal sum of Twenty eight hundred and no/100 Dollars, in and to the United States of the present standard of weight and fineness, being for a loan thereof made by the said parties of the second part, to the said parties of the first part, and payable according to the tenor and effect of a certain negotiable promissory note, numbered 1002, executed and delivered by the said parties of the first part, bearing date November 24th, 1908, payable to the order of said parties of the second part, 6 months after date, at Bank of Commerce with interest thereon from date until maturity, at the rate of 10 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of January and July, in each year, and 10 per cent per annum after maturity, the installments of interest being further evidenced by coupons attached to said principal note and of even date therewith and payable to the order of said parties of the second part.

SECOND: Said parties of the first part agree to pay all taxes and assessments on said lands and premises when the same are due, and to keep all buildings and improvements on said land insured in some responsible fire insurance company, to the satisfaction of the holder hereof in the sum of \$200.00 Dollars, the policy to be made payable to the holder hereof, as additional security to this loan and if the taxes or insurance premiums are not paid when due, by the parties of the first part, the holder hereof may pay the same, and this mortgage shall be security also for such payments, with interest thereon at the rate of 12 per cent per annum and the first part shall assume all responsibility of proofs and care and expense of collecting said insurance if loss occurs.

THIRD: The said parties of the first part agree to keep all buildings, fences and improvements on said land in as good repair as they now are, and to not commit or allow any waste on said premises.

FOURTH: In case of default in any of the covenants hereof, the rents and profits of the said premises are pledged to the holder hereof as additional collateral security for the payment of the moneys herein mentioned, and the holder is entitled to the possession thereof by receiver or otherwise.

FIFTH: Said parties of the first part agree that if the maker of said note shall fail to pay the principal or interest of said note, or any part thereof as the same become due or any of the taxes, assessments or insurance premiums, as they become due or to comply with any of the foregoing covenants, the whole sum of money hereby secured shall at the option of the holder hereof become due and payable at once, and without notice.

The said parties of the first part, shall pay all expenses of collecting the insurance, and in the event action is brought to foreclose this mortgage or recover on the insurance policy, a reasonable attorney's fee of not less than \$100.00 Dollars shall be added, which this mortgage also secures.

And that the said parties of the first part, for said consideration, do hereby expressly waive an appraisal of said real estate and all benefit of the homestead exemption and stay laws of the State of Oklahoma.

The foregoing conditions being performed, this conveyance to be void; otherwise of full force and virtue.
