

# MORTGAGE OF REAL PROPERTY

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 20th day of April, A. D., 1907, between P. M. Iverson and Marie H. Iverson his wife, and L. W. Sumpter witnesseth, that

WHEREAS, the said P. M. Iverson is justly indebted to the said L. W. Sumpter in the sum of Fifteen Hundred DOLLARS (\$1500.00) which is evidence by one certain promissory note of even date herewith, to-wit:

One note due April 20, 1908, for \$1500.00 with privilege of paying \$100 at any time to be credited on note  
One note due       , 190   for \$       and one note due       , 190   for \$      

NOW, THEREFORE, the said P. M. Iverson and Marie H. Iverson his wife, for the better securing the payment of the money aforesaid, with interest thereon according to the tenor and effect of said note above mentioned, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said

L. W. Sumpter his heirs and assigns forever, the following described real estate, to-wit:  
The Easterly forty five (45) feet of Lot seven (7) and the Easterly forty five (45) feet of Lot eight (8) in Block one hundred and two (102) in City of Tulsa, Indian Territory according to Government plat and survey thereof.

with all the improvements thereon at the present time, or that hereafter may be placed thereon, together with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the above granted, bargained, and described premises unto the said L. W. Sumpter his heirs and assigns and unto his own proper use, benefit and behoof forever.

AND WHEREAS, For the further security of said indebtedness, the said P. M. Iverson of the first part, covenant and agree with the said L. W. Sumpter of the second part, to keep the improvements on the said property at all times in a state of good repair and constantly insured for the benefit of the said L. W. Sumpter his heirs and assigns in one or more insurance companies satisfactory to the said L. W. Sumpter of the second part, against fire, lightning or tornadoes. Should the P. M. Iverson of the first part make default in the performance of any of these stipulations, the said L. W. Sumpter of the second part may immediately perform and discharge the same, and all accounts so expended by the said L. W. Sumpter of the second part, heirs or assigns, in paying said taxes, insurance premiums, loans or special assessments or in protecting said title, or making said repairs, shall become a debt due in addition to the indebtedness aforesaid, and secured in like manner by this mortgage, and shall bear interest from the time of the payment thereof at the rate of eight per cent per annum payable on demand.

And for the consideration aforesaid, and for divers other good and valuable considerations, I, Marie H. Iverson wife of said P. M. Iverson, do hereby release and quit-claim unto the said L. W. Sumpter his heirs and assigns, all my right, claim or possibility of dower in and out of the aforescribed premises.

CONDITIONED, However, that if the said P. M. Iverson his heirs, executors, or administrators, shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid to the said L. W. Sumpter, his executors, administrators, or assigns, the aforesaid sum of money, with interest thereon, according to the tenor of said note, then this instrument shall be void otherwise to remain in full force and effect.
