

# GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

**THIS INDENTURE**, Made and entered into this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of July, one thousand nine hundred and six, by and between Karl Bowers and Ida Bowers, being the father and mother, of Kosciusko Bowers, deceased, parties of the first part, and The Pioneer Land Company, a corporation of Mounds, Ind. Tex., party of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of

Two Thousand DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the Muskogee ( Creek ) Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The West half of the South West quarter, also, lot eight (8) and the West ten (10) acres of lot seven (7), of section twenty-four (24), township seventeen (17) North, range fourteen (14) East of the Indian base and meridian, containing 119 <sup>90</sup>/<sub>100</sub> acres, more or less.

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said The Pioneer Land Company and assigns and its heirs and successors in fee simple forever; and we the said Karl Bowers and Ida Bowers, for ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators do lawfully covenant with the said The Pioneer Land Company and its heirs, successors and assigns, that we are lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that they are free from all incumbrances, that we have good right to sell and convey the same to said

The Pioneer Land Company as aforesaid; and that we will and our successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said The Pioneer Land Company and its heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Ida Bowers, wife of Karl Bowers, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
