

GENERAL WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER

THIS INDENTURE, Made and entered into this 15th day of October, one thousand nine hundred and six,
by and between G. P. Sampson and Mary Sampson, husband and wife of Checotah Indian Territory,
parties of the first part, and Albert Newhouse and John H. King,
of Muskogee, Indian Territory, parties of the second part;

WITNESSETH, That that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand

DOLLARS, in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,
do hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part the following described real estate and premises situated in the
Muskogee or Creek Nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The South half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the North West Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section
Thirty three (33), and the South half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of North East Quarter of section Thirty two (32) all in Township seventeen ($\frac{1}{2}$) North
of Range Nineteen ($\frac{1}{2}$ East), same being the allotment of George A. Sampson deceased, a son of first justice, who died
January 13, 1900.

together with all the improvements thereon, and the appurtenances and immunities thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereto.

To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said Albert Newhouse and John H. King,
and their heirs and successors, in fee simple forever; and the said G. P. Sampson and Mary Sampson
for ourselves and our heirs, executors and administrators do covenant with the said Albert Newhouse and John H. King,
and their heirs, successors and assigns, that we are lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises; that
they are free from all incumbrances, except by us, and that we have good right to sell and convey the same to said Albert Newhouse
and John H. King, aforesaid; and that we will and our successors, heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said Albert Newhouse and John H. King,
and their heirs, successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

And I, Mary Sampson, wife of said G. P. Sampson, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said party of the second part all my right of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
